Don't sweat the small stuff

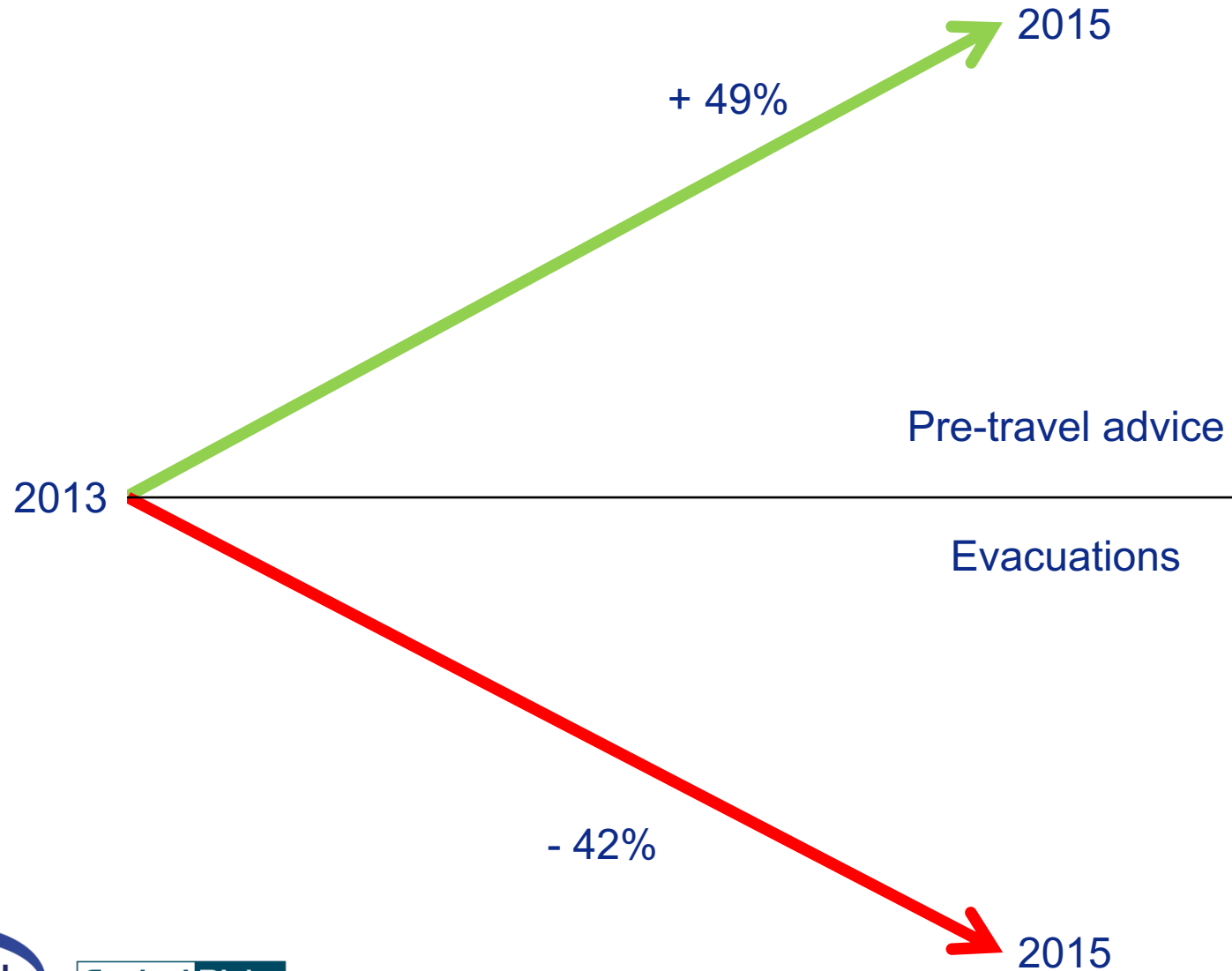


Regulation

- Legal v Moral
 - It's not 'the right thing to do' because it's the law*...
 - ... it's the law* because it's the right thing to do
- Caveat: 'Compliance' v 'Compulsion'
- Simple
- Cheap
- Relevant / proportionate
- Not counter-productive
